

2024 Request for Proposals: Cancer Prevention in Maine

Our Goals

Foster Prevention Practices: The best cancer is the one that never occurs. Prevention strategies have a proven impact on reducing cancer incidence rates.

Increase Cancer Screening: Early detection saves lives. Cancer screening tests can detect cancer in its earliest stages, when it is most treatable.

Improve Patient Outcomes: Maine Cancer Foundation supports efforts to improve patient outcomes by increasing access to care and ensuring the best cancer care is available for all Mainers.

Health Equity

To achieve health equity, we need to reduce the differences in health due to systematic social or economic disadvantage. Health equity is the "attainment of the highest level of health for all people."[1] Maine Cancer Foundation is committed to addressing health inequities, ensuring all Mainers have access to critical cancer prevention, screening, and treatment resources. Proposals that address social determinants of health will be prioritized.

Funding Criteria

Cancer remains the leading cause of death in Maine, impacting thousands of Mainers each year. Fortunately, there are many ways to reduce cancer risk and prevent certain types of cancer, ultimately reducing the burden of the disease in our state.

To support cancer prevention efforts, Maine Cancer Foundation is now accepting applications for evidence-based interventions to reduce the risk of cancer in Maine.

Cancer Prevention Focus Areas that will be considered:

- o Alcohol Use
- o Arsenic
- HPV Vaccinations
- Obesity Prevention
- o Radon
- Sun Safety
- Tobacco Use (Prevention and/or Treatment)

Proposals should utilize evidence-based practices in preventing cancer. Please refer to the <u>Maine Cancer</u> <u>Plan 2021-2025</u> as a reference for cancer prevention strategies.



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Areas of Focus

Maine Cancer Foundation is most interested in providing funds for programs that do one or more of the following:

- Implement policy, systems, and environmental (PSE) changes;
- o Include clearly defined goals and measurable results;
- Implement best practices related to cancer prevention;
- Demonstrate collaboration among Maine organizations;
- o Pilot a new idea (using evidence-based guidelines);
- Increase and improve cancer prevention in geographically underserved regions of Maine and with people who are marginalized and/or have an increased risk for cancer. Such populations can include, but are not limited to, uninsured or underinsured individuals, rural populations, racial and ethnic minorities, and/or the LGBTQIA+ community.

If you have received past MCF grant support for a cancer prevention project, please describe the outcomes of your prior project in your application.

We recommend that you contact Maine Cancer Foundation to discuss your proposal prior to submission or if you have questions about your eligibility. MCF is willing to discuss project concepts and review draft applications up until one week ahead of the deadline. We highly encourage applicants to submit a draft application for review and feedback. Grant Term

One or two years. You are not required to apply for two years of funding.

Request amounts

Maximum request amount is \$25,000 per year for two years (\$50,000 total). Please note, requests do not have to meet the maximum amount. Smaller, pilot projects are also encouraged.

What We Will Not Fund

- Organizations that are not a 501(c)3 tax-exempt charitable organization, educational institution, government entity or other public, non-profit entity (e.g. health department, university);
- Direct support to individuals;
- Business investments or loans;
- o Programs that do not benefit the people of Maine;
- o Capital campaigns or contributions to endowments.

Application Process

Deadlines

Applications must be completed by **5pm on Friday**, **May 31**, **2024**. Awards will be announced by July 31, 2024. Funds are distributed upon receipt of a signed contract provided by Maine Cancer Foundation. All applicants who receive awards will be required to report on their grant results to Maine Cancer Foundation during the grant period.

Additional Information

Geographic distribution of grants will be considered and multiple grants to the same institution or system may be limited.

Maine Cancer Foundation will not knowingly support projects that discriminate on the basis of race, creed, religion, sex, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation.

A grant recipient's work must support MCF's mission. Funds may not be diverted to benefit any individual. The results or benefits of any Foundation-supported initiative or program are required to remain in the public domain for the benefit of Maine people.
